

Activity Name:	Twilight Athletics Carnival - Years 3-6
Date/Time:	Tuesday 1 August 2023 3:30pm - 8:00pm
Description:	<p>Our 3-6 Athletics Carnival for 2023 will be held on Tuesday, 1st August from 3:30pm - 8:00pm at the NSW Academy of Sport, Narrabeen. All 3-6 students are invited to participate in the track and field carnival. We are having another twilight carnival this year due to extensive repairs to the track at the Academy of Sport which have taken place throughout term 2, leaving few available dates for school carnivals. Our school missed out on a day carnival date.</p> <p>All students wishing to attend are expected to travel to and from the venue with their parents.</p> <p>Any Yr2 students who are turning 8 or who have already turned 8 in 2023 may choose to compete with the Primary and participate in the Junior (8, 9 and 10yr) races and field events.</p> <p>Students may participate in track (100m, 200m, 800m & 1500m) and field events (Shot Put, High Jump and Long Jump). There will only be a competitive event for each of the field events (no participation event as we usually hold). Students will sign up for all events via the School Interviews website. By providing permission you are also acknowledging that you have completed the registration in school interviews as above.</p> <p>Entries will close on Friday, 21st July to allow time for formation of heats and to run trials if necessary. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE TAKEN.</p>

	<p>If we have a large number of entries for Shot Put or High Jump, we may hold a trial for some age groups at school during PDHPE Lessons or lunchtimes, prior to the carnival, with the top 10 students progressing to the final competition at the carnival. If this is to happen, we will notify the students involved prior to the trial.</p> <p>All 3-6 children are expected to sit in their respective House Groups, in the grandstand, except when competing or visiting the bathroom. Parents should sit with their child in the grandstand as there will be no teacher supervision.</p> <p>The program for the events will be sent home in the week before the carnival.</p> <p>We are looking forward to a fantastic carnival.</p>

Additional Information:	<p>Important information in the event of injury, no personal injury insurance cover is provided by the NSW Department of Education for students in relation to school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school activity. Concussion clearance

The Australian Medical Association recommends students being symptom free of concussion for 14 days before returning to sport.

- If your child/ward sustains a concussion, or experiences any concussion symptoms, in the 14 day period prior to the event commencing, you must report this to team officials, and a medical clearance is required in order for your child/ward to participate in the event.
- Medical clearances can be attached to this consent form or can be submitted to team officials separately.

Parent/Carer acknowledgement and Consent

- I can confirm that I understand that, in the event of injury, no personal injury insurance cover is provided by the NSW Department of Education for students in relation to school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school activity.
